## Above and BEYOND



Thank you to FF/PM Brian Lykins for his hard work on coordinating the annual cot service and maintenance with Stryker Medical Equipment.


The staff of Premier Health thanks all our crews for their professionalism and communication when activating trauma incidents.






## TOTAL ALARMS


## ALARMS BY SERVICE TYPE


## RESPONSE PERCENTAGES

# SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 11/2/20 @ 19:35 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews noted light smoke in the garage. Residents discharged a dry chemical extinguisher to put out an oven fire. Upon investigation, crews found a small fire inside the oven. Crews extinguished the fire, removed the appliance from the building, and checked for extension within the kitchen walls. Finding no extension, crews performed ventilation. The estimated property damage due to the fire is \$1,000.



On 11/3/20 @ 20:44 hours, Crews responded to a nursing home facility for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews discovered a patient unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS procedures. Patient care ceased after Facility staff provided the proper Do Not Resuscitate paperwork. Crews released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 11/3/2020 @ 21:26 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found smoke coming from the chimney and entered the building to investigate. Crews encountered smoke inside with thicker smoke coming from the firebox. Crews performed overhaul procedures around the firebox and discovered the fire extended into the walls. After removing the drywall, crews extinguished the fire and checked the firebox and chimney flue pipe for any additional extension. Crews found no further extension. The estimated property damage due to the fire is \$60,000.



On 11/16/20 @ 11:48 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a small lawn tractor on fire with no exposures. Crews stretched a hand line and extinguished the fire. Crews found no additional hazards. The estimated property damage due to the fire \$1,000.

On 11/22/20 @ 23:01 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a single-story residence with nothing showing from the exterior. Upon entering the structure, crews determined the fire was isolated to the firebox and flue pipe. Crews extinguished the fire and found no extension beyond the firebox. The estimated property damage due to the fire is \$500.

On 11/22/20 @ 11:08 hours, Crews responded to mutual aid into the City of Lebanon for a reported motor vehicle collision. Upon arrival, crews found a City of Lebanon medic struck by a semi-truck. Crews extricated the driver of the medic. After extricating the driver, crews remained in the City of Lebanon to provide area coverage during the remainder of the incident.

On 11/26/20 @ 16:55 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews made entry into the residence and discovered a grease fire that occurred in a pan. The homeowner extinguished the fire and removed the pan from the residence before the crew's arrival. Crews found no active fire and minimal smoke in the house. After investigation, crews found no fire extension and ensured ventilation to remove the remaining smoke. The estimated property damage due to the fire is \$1,500.



On 11/28/20 @ 21:37 hours, crews responded to a private residence for a reported seizure/convulsion. While on route, Warren County Dispatch updated crews to a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found the patient unresponsive. Crews initiated ALS interventions and transported the patient to Franklin Emergency Care.

Each Station completed three individual hours of company development.


## PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT
