




Total Alarms


Alarms by Service Type


Response Percentages

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 12/2/21 @ 20:50 hours, Crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive with a family member administering CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Franklin Emergency Care.


On 12/3/21 @ 13:57 hours, Crews responded to Old State Route 122 for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles with heavy damage and entrapped occupants. One vehicle sustained front-end damage, with the occupant trapped and unresponsive. The other vehicle also sustained front-end damage and rolled onto the passenger side with two occupants entrapped but alert. Rescue 21 and Medic 23 crews extricated the unresponsive patient. After freeing the patient, Medic 22 crews initiated ALS procedures and transferred patient care to Miami Valley CareFlight. Engine 22 crews stabilized the rolled-over vehicle and removed the windshield to allow Medic 21 crews access to the occupants. Crews extricated two occupants from this vehicle and transported one patient to Atrium Medical Center.



On 12/4/21 @ 09:30 hours, Crews responded to a nursing care facility for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.


On 12/9/21 @ 16:43 hours, crews responded to North Main and Lytle Five Points road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two cars with front-end damage, with all occupants out of the vehicles. Engine 22 and Springboro PD shielded the scene. Medic crews transported one patient to Kettering Health Franklin. With no further injuries reported, crews secured road hazards and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 12/4/21 @ 10:12 hours, Crews responded to Winding Creek Boulevard for a reported animal rescue. Upon arrival, crews found a deer trapped in the basement of a house under construction. With assistance from bystanders and Clearcreek PD, crews secured the deer with rope, carried it out of the basement, and released it.



On 12/9/21 @ 17:42 hours, Crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive with family performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Franklin.

On 12/9/21 @ 19:45 hours, crews responded to State Route 73 and Bunnell Hill Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles, one car with front-end damage and one with passenger-side damage. All occupants evacuated their vehicles without crew assistance. Medic units transported two patients to Children's Dayton South. After stabilizing the cars and clearing the roadway of hazards, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 12/13/21 @ 09:08 hours, Crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 12/14/21 @ 09:52 hours, Crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 12/18/21 @ 10:05 hours, Crews responded with a mutual aid medic from the City of Franklin to Central Avenue for a vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found one vehicle involved in a crash with the driver unresponsive. Rescue 21 crews removed the driver and transferred care to Medic 17.

On 12/19/21 @ 12:04 hours, Crews responded to a residence for reported chest pains. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 12/20/21 @ 18:51 hours, Crews responded to Old 122 and Utica Road for a vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a semi-truck and an SUV involved in a crash with one patient entrapped. Medic 23 and Clearcreek PD shielded the scene while Rescue 21 crews extricated one patient. Once freed, Medic 23 crews initiated ALS procedures and transferred the patient to Miami Valley CareFlight. Engine 22 crews cleared the roadway of hazards and released the scene to the Ohio State Patrol.

On 12/22/21 @ 11:30 hours, Crews responded to a residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 12/23/21 @ 23:10 hours, Crews responded to Milo Beck Park for a reported gunshot. Upon arrival, Springboro PD secured the scene, and crews found one patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 12/27/21 @ 15:37 hours, Crews responded to State Route 48 for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found three cars involved in a crash with multiple injuries and one patient entrapped. Rescue 21 crews extricated one patient and transferred care to Miami Valley CareFlight. Medic crews transported four patients to Atrium Medical Center. Crews secured the road of hazards and released the scene to Clearcreek PD. Joint Emergency Medical Services provided mutual aid assistance.

On 12/31/21 @ 21:25 hours, Crews responded to a nursing home for a reported unknown medical problem. Upon arrival, crews found a patient with abdominal pain. During assessment, the patient went into cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

Crews completed Fire Core Competency-Based training on Forcible Entry.




EMS Training
