


RESPONSE BY DAY OF WEEK





ALARMS BY SERVICE TYPE




RESPONSE PERCENTAGES



SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 12/1/19 @ 11:07 hours, Crews responded to the intersection of North State Route 741 and West State Route 122 for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a two-vehicle accident with both vehicles sustaining heavy damage. Crews transported two patients to Atrium Medical Center.



On 12/1/19 @ 17:23 hours, Crews responded to Interstate 75 for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews discovered a multi vehicle accident with a fatality. Crews assisted with triage and treatment of patients on the scene, transporting one patient to Atrium Medical Center. This call was determined to be in the City of Franklin.

On 12/1/19 @ 20:58 hours, Crews responded to Lytle Five Points Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a two-vehicle accident with heavy damage and entrapment. Crews performed extrication for the entrapped individual and transported three patients to Miami Valley Hospital South Emergency Room.

On 12/6/19 @ 06:14 hours, Crews responded to Evergreen Drive for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 45-year-old female in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Franklin Emergency Care.

On 12/7/19 @ 14:46 hours, Crews responded to Wayne Boulevard for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews reported a working fire with smoke showing. Crews quickly deployed hose lines for an interior attack. Crews extinguished the fire and determined all occupants evacuated the structure. Crews performed ventilation and overhaul with no extension found. Franklin Township and Turtlecreek Township provided mutual aid assistance. Estimated damage from fire is \$30,000.

On 12/8/19 @ 11:30 hours, Crews responded to West Central Avenue for a reported unknown medical condition. While responding, Warren County Communications upgraded the call to a non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 21-year-old female not breathing but presenting a pulse. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Franklin Emergency Care.

On 12/8/19 @ 11:53 hours, Crews responded to East Central Avenue for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 70-year-old female in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a termination of resuscitation efforts order.

On 12/11/19 @ 01:08 hours, Crews responded to Cobbler Court for a reported fall. Upon arrival, crews found a 49-year-old female with severe facial trauma from a gunshot wound. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 12/11/19 @ 12:53 hours, Crews responded to King Court for a reported unconscious patient. Upon arrival, crews found a 98-year-old female pulseless and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Franklin Emergency Care.


On 12/13/19 @ 13:00 hours, Crews responded to Cedar Hill Lane for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews reported a working fire. Crews quickly deployed hose lines into the structure for an interior attack and primary search. Crews quickly extinguished the fire and verified all occupants evacuated the structure. Crews rescued two dogs from the building. Crews checked for extension and performed salvage and overhaul. Washington Township and Miami Valley provided mutual aid assistance. Estimated damage due to fire is \$20,000.



On 12/23/19 @ 15:19 hours, Crews responded to the intersection of West Lytle Five Points Road and Yankee Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found three vehicles involved with one driver entrapped. Crews performed extrication of the entrapped individual. Crews transported one patient to Southview Medical Center and one patient to Atrium Medical Center.



On 12/26/19 @ 08:33 hours, Crews responded to the intersection of East Central Avenue and Richards Run for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found three vehicles with heavy damage. Crews transported one patient to Sycamore Medical Center and one patient to Southview Medical Center.



On 12/28/19 @ 15:28 hours, Crews responded to Cedar Hill Lane for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews discovered a working fire in the front room of the structure. Crews quickly deployed hose lines for an interior attack and extinguished the fire. Crews confirmed all occupants evacuated the structure. Crews checked for extension and performed ventilation. Estimated damage from fire is \$12,000.

On 12/29/19 @ 11:09 hours, Crews responded to Yankee Road for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found an 85-year-old male DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

FIRE & RESCUE TRAINING


