



Kudos to Lt. Larry Carman who, in cooperation with the Springboro High School SADD Council, did a fantastic job with planning the Mock Crash on March 30th.


Station Response Percentages

Mutual Aid




Significant Response Activity

On 3/8/17 @ 12:34 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded Stolle Court for an unconscious patient. Shortly after, Warren County Communications upgraded the response to a non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found the patient unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS procedures and obtained a pulse. The patient remained unresponsive, but breathing with a pulse present. Crews transported patient to Southview ER.

On 3/8/17 @ 14:31 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to the intersection of State Route 48 and Bunnell Hill Road. Upon arrival, crews found an SUV with heavy damage after a collision with a tow truck. Crews found two patients entrapped in the SUV. After assessment, crews discovered the driver met non-initiation of care criteria. The passenger sustained life-threatening injuries and crews rapidly extricated the patient. Crews transported the passenger to the landing zone and transferred patient care to CareFlight, who transported the patient to Miami Valley Hospital. Miami Valley CareFlight provided mutual aid assistance.

On 3/8/17 @ 17:49 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to the intersection of Old State Route 122 and Township Line Road for a motorcycle accident. Upon arrival, crews found one patient semi-conscious and presenting with life threatening

injuries. Crews initiated patient care, provided transported to the landing zone, and transferred patient care to CareFlight. Miami Valley CareFlight provided mutual aid assistance.

On 3/11/17 @ 20:07 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to Haverstraw Place for difficulty breathing. Dispatch upgraded the call to a non-breather. The patient was unresponsive, not breathing, and no pulse present. Crews initiated ALS procedures but the patient did not respond to treatment. Crews consulted with medical control and received orders to terminate resuscitation efforts.

On 3/14/17 @ 23:00 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to Sesame Street for a reported overdose. Upon arrival, crews found an unresponsive patient in the driveway. Crews initiated ALS care and administered Narcan, resulting in the patient regaining some consciousness. Crews transported the patient to Franklin Kettering ER.

On 3/14/17 @ 23:56 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to Bunnell Hill Road for a reported overdose. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive. Crews initiated ALS care and administered Narcan, resulting in the patient regaining some consciousness. Crews transported the patient to Atrium ER.

On 3/16/17 @ 18:06 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to Old State Route 122 for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews determined that it was a fully involved barn with exposure to a two-story residential building. Crews initiated exposure control tactics, prevented extension to the residence, and confirmed an "all clear". Later arriving units deployed multiple hose lines, bringing the fire under control. The barn was a total loss. Wayne Township, Turtlecreek Township, and Washington Township Fire Departments provide mutual aid assistance.

On 3/23/17 @ 06:55 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to South Main Street for an MVA. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles with heavy damage. Crews transported two juvenile patients with minor injuries to Children's Hospital South and transported one adult patient, also with minor injuries, to Franklin Kettering.

On 3/26/17 @ 02:16 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to West Pekin Road for a fire alarm activation. Shortly after, Dispatch upgraded the incident to a working structure fire. Upon arrival, crews discovered a structure with heavy fire involvement. Battalion 21 requested two additional engines. Crews attacked the fire using a defensive strategy due to the amount of fire involvement. Later arriving units established a water supply down a long lane. Crews successfully suppressed the main body of fire and transition to an offensive strategy. Advancing lines to the interior, crews continued extinguishment, performed salvage/overhaul, and cut the fire off. The City of Franklin, Franklin Township, Wayne Township, and Turtlecreek Township Fire Departments provided mutual aid assistance.

On 3/26/17 @ 13:31 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to the intersection of North State Route 741 and Weidner Road for an MVA. Shortly after, dispatch upgraded the incident to an MVA with entrapment and vehicle on fire. Responders requested an additional engine and medic to the scene. Upon arrival, crews found three vehicles with heavy damage and entrapment but no active fire to any vehicles. Crews performed extrication, patient care, and transported four patients Atrium ER.

On 3/27/17 @ 04:24 hours, CCFD Fire/EMS crews responded to West Pekin Road for a structure fire. Upon arrival, crews discovered a working structure fire. Crews attacked the fire in a defensive strategy and established a water supply down a long lane. Crews continued extinguishing the fire from a defensive position due to a compromised structural integrity of the house. The City of Franklin Fire Department provided mutual aid assistance.
