




TOTAL ALARMS


ALARMS BY SERVICE TYPE

2019 = 5.92	2019 = 5.85


RESPONSE PERCENTAGES

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 3/2/20 @ 06:17 hours, Crews responded to a nursing home facility for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive and began ALS interventions with no response. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 3/2/20 @ 09:19 hours, Crews responded to a nursing home facility for a reported unconscious patient. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in respiratory distress. The patient went into cardiac arrest during transport to the hospital. Crews performed ALS procedures and transported the patient to Southview Medical Center.



On 3/6/20 @ 20:23 hours, Crews responded to Red Lion Five Points Road for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found nothing showing from the exterior. Crews entered the structure and found smoke but had to investigate the source. Upon investigation, crews located a box on fire in a closet. Crews extinguished the fire and performed overhaul to insure no extension into the attic space. Estimated damage due to fire is \$3,000.



On 3/17/20 @ 15:32 hours, Crews responded to a parking lot of a business for a reported overdose. Upon arrival, crews found a patient breathing but unresponsive, seated in a car. Crews performed ALS procedures and transported the patient to Miami Valley Hospital Austin Boulevard Emergency Center.

On 3/19/20 @ 05:41 hours, Crews responded to a nursing home facility for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek Township PD.

On 3/23/20 @ 10:34 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for reported unconscious patient. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive from an apparent overdose. Crews performed ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 3/26/20 @ 18:14 hours, Crews responded to Ryan Road for a reported appliance fire. Upon arrival, crews found smoke coming out of the front door and upgraded the call to a structure fire. Crews pulled a hose line and entered the structure where they found smoke coming from the kitchen area near the oven. A board under the oven caught fire, along with other materials in a drawer under the oven. Crews removed the oven, extinguished the fire, and checked the surrounding areas for extension. All occupants evacuated the building prior to arrival. Estimated damage due to fire is \$1,500.



On 3/30/20 @ 15:03 hours, Crews responded to a nursing home facility for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Nursing home staff presented crews with a valid do not resuscitate order. Crews did not initiate patient care and pronounced the patient dead at scene. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.
