Above and BEYOND








TOTAL ALARMS


ALARMS BY SERVICE TYPE


RESPONSE PERCENTAGES

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 5/5/20 @ 04:09 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 5/5/20 @ 15:15 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 5/6/20 @ 02:04 hours, Crews responded to Springboro Road for a reported vehicle crash with injury. Upon arrival, crews found a single vehicle crashed into a telephone pole and on fire in the grass. The driver evacuated the vehicle prior to crew arrival. Crews extinguished the fire and assessed the driver for injuries.

On 5/7/20 @ 06:09 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 5/11/20 @ 19:22 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a single-story residence with a working fire in the garage extending into the attic space. All occupants evacuated the house. Crews deployed an attack line and began extinguishing the fire. Additional crews made entry into the structure to check for extension. Crews ventilated the structure and requested Duke Energy to disconnect gas and electric service. Crews extinguished the fire and found no extension into the attic space. Washington Township and Miami Valley Fire District provided mutual aid assistance. Estimated damage due to fire is \$70,000.



On 5/14/20 @ 17:19 hours, Crews responded to State Route 73 for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a truck with light smoke coming from the engine compartment. Crews found no active fire within the engine and applied pressurized water from an extinguisher until the smoke cleared.



On 5/19/20 @ 11:20 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 5/24/20 @ 13:08 hours, Crews responded to a grocery store for a reported unconscious patient. Communications upgraded the call to a non-breather shortly after dispatch. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS procedures and quickly transferred the patient to the medic unit. The patient regained a pulse and breathing during transport to Atrium Medical Center.

On 5/27/20 @ 05:35 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, found a patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 5/27/20 @ 06:41 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported overdose. Communications upgraded the call to a non-breather shortly after dispatch. Upon arrival, crews found a patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTIVITY

During May, Chief Agenbroad, Assistant Chief Simpson, Captain Buehler, and Captain Urban spent many hours revising and implementing COVID-19 operational plans, both departmentally and at the Warren County Emergency Operations Center level. Additionally, Chief Agenbroad participated in many daily activities and meetings in support of this evolving situation. Some of these include Warren County Fire Chiefs' Association, Warren County Health Department Coronavirus Task Force, and the Unified Command Team at the Warren County Emergency Management Agency Emergency Operations Center. Many of these activities involved ongoing daily virtual meetings and conference telephone calls.

On 5/7/20 and 5/14/20, Assistant Chief Simpson and Captain Cox participated in several Project Tri-Tech virtual meetings relating to the ongoing work on implementation of the new Mobile CAD and Mapping interface. Additionally, Assistant Chief Simpson attended several virtual trainings relating to the project (SSR Report Writer and Output Designer) the weeks of 5/11/20 and 5/18/20.

During May, the Fire District completed and submitted the application for the FY 2020 FEMA COVID-19 Assistance to Firefighters Grant Supplemental program. This program helps provide funding for the purchase of additional personal protective equipment for firefighters and first responders managing emergencies during the Coronavirus pandemic.



Grilling Fire Safety

Stay fire safe this summer! Follow these grilling safety tips.

-  Only use your grill outside. Keep it at least 3 feet from siding, deck rails and eaves.
-  Clean your grill after each use. This will remove grease that can start a fire.
-  Open your gas grill before lighting.
-  Keep a 3-foot safe zone around your grill. This will keep kids and pets safe.
-  Place the coals from your grill in a metal can with a lid once they have cooled.
-  Keep an eye on your grill, fire pit or patio torches. Don't walk away from them when they are lit.
