


ALARMS BY SERVICE TYPE


RESPONSE PERCENTAGES

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 5/3/21 @ 15:43 hours, crews responded to a local business for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a large mulch grinder involved with fire in the engine compartment. Engine 22 crews pulled two hose lines, attacked the fire, and requested Engine 23 assistance due to the location being remote from water supply. Crews extinguished the fire using two tanks of water and dry chemical. Once extinguished, crews checked for hot spots and performed overhaul. The estimated property damage from fire is \$500,000.



On 5/8/21 @ 19:21 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported unconscious person. Upon arrival, crews found the patient unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS interventions without change in the patient's condition. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 5/17/21 @ 00:35 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported trash bin that caught fire. The resident discarded some hot coals into the bin causing it to catch fire and extinguished the fire prior to crew arrival. The fire also melted the vinyl siding of the house. Crews checked the house for extension and found no further hazards. The estimated damage from fire is \$500.

On 5/10/21 @ 03:43 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found the patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 5/12/21 @ 10:21 hours, Crews responded to Springboro Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a single vehicle off the road with moderate damage from impact with a utility pole. Crews noted a transformer and wires on the ground. The driver, who was unsure of the location of the wires, did not evacuate the vehicle. Crews stabilized the vehicle, evacuated the driver, and contacted Duke Energy for the damaged utilities. The driver did not report any injuries. Crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 5/14/21 @ 21:29 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported barn fire. Upon arrival, crews reported a working barn fire with heavy fire conditions. Crews made an initial attack to knock the fire down while setting up a water supply. Due to a lack of hydrants in the area, crews used tankers to extinguish the fire. Crews performed overhaul and determined the fire did not extend from the barn. Wayne Township and Turtlecreek Township provided mutual aid assistance.



On 5/15/21 @ 08:00 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews discovered the patient unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS interventions without a change in the patient's condition. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 5/30/21 @ 11:31 hours, Crews responded to a nursing home facility for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found the patient unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS interventions without a change in the patient's condition. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.
