In July, crews completed a core-competency training on hand-line deployment. This training takes quite a bit of teamwork, communication, and physical agility. With an engine parked 50-ft away from the bay door, crews must deploy a hose, don their breathing apparatus, and "charge" the water line prior to entering the building. Once inside, crews must deploy the charged line, weighing approximately 125 lbs, through the building, avoiding obstacles, until they reach the "fire" and spray water at a designated target.



During this training, crews competed for bragging rights for the fastest time and a free lunch from the Chief. The best station average goes to Unit 2, Station 21. The cumulative average is a tie between Units 1 and 2. Therefore, the tiebreaker goes to Unit 1 for the fastest station average time of 2:03 minutes. Congratulations Unit 1 on your victory!




RESPONSE BY DAY OF WEEK





SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 7/2/19 @ 12:00 hours, Crews responded to West State Route 122 for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 45-year-old female in cardiac arrest. Crews performed ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medial Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the Coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 7/4/19 @ 22:18 hours, Crews responded to Turning Leaf Crossing for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a two-story residential structure with smoke showing. Crews determined the smoke came from fence materials smoldering from fireworks set off in the area. Upon investigation, crews found the fire contained to the exterior of the house with no extension into the structure. Crews extinguished the smoldering materials. Estimated property damage due to fire is \$300.



On 7/8/19 @ 08:55 hours, Crews responded to Hiawatha Trail for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 33-year-old female in cardiac arrest. Crews performed ALS procedures and transported the patient to Franklin Emergency Care.

On 7/10/19 at 07:43 hours, Crews responded to Drake Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a four-door sedan on its top and off the roadway with the driver partially evacuated through the passenger side window. Crews stopped traffic to secure the scene and checked the vehicle for hazards prior to extricating the driver. After stabilizing the patient, crews transported a 21-year-old female to Atrium Medical Center.

On 7/15/19 @ 12:43 hours, Crews responded to Teakwood Lane for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a single-family tri-level home with smoke coming through a vent in the roof. Crews made entry into the structure and found fire in the bathroom with heat signatures between the bathroom and kitchen. Crews extinguished the fire using a hand line and checked for extension. Investigation showed the fire stayed contained to the bathroom with no extension into the attic. Crews performed overhaul and completed a final check for extension. Estimated damage from fire is \$35,000.



On 7/16/19 @ 16:42 hours, Crews responded to West Pekin Road for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a working boat fire in close proximity to a truck and an enclosed trailer. Crews extinguished the fire using a front bumper hose then applied a foam blanket to the boat. No fire extended to the truck or enclosed trailer. Estimated damage due to fire is \$23,500.



On 7/20/19 @ 18:02 hours, Crews responded to Riley Wills Road for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 34-year-old male DOA. Crews contacted the Coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 7/23/19 at 12:00 hours, Crews responded to Pugh Drive for a reported overdose. Upon arrival, Crews found a 17-year-old male who reported taking an unspecified number of prescription medications. After completing an assessment, crews transported the patient to Dayton Children's South.

On 7/23/19 @ 12:18 hours, Crews responded to East Central Avenue for an unconscious/unresponsive person. Upon arrival, crews found a 79-year-old female with labored respirations. While en-route to the hospital the patient went into cardiac arrest. Crews performed ALS procedures and transported the patient to Southview Medical Center.

On 7/24/19 @ 12:32 hours, Crews responded to Turner Drive for a reported unconscious/unresponsive person. Upon arrival, crews found a 90-year-old male in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

On 7/26/19 @ 13:16 hours, Crews responded to the intersection of West State Route 73 and Bunnell Hill Road for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a semi-truck with smoke and fire showing from the battery compartment under the cab. Crews extinguished the fire using a carbon dioxide extinguisher on the battery compartment and a hand-line for the cab area. Crews applied a foam blanket to affected areas.



On 7/27/19 at 19:05 hours, Crews responded to East State Route 73 for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 51-year-old male in cardiac arrest with Clearcreek PD performing CPR. Crews performed ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 7/28/19 at 07:20 hours, Crews responded to Woods Road for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found an 84-year-old woman in cardiac arrest. Crews performed ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 7/29/19 @ 18:29 hours, Crews responded to the intersection of West Central Avenue and Springwood Drive for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found four vehicles involved with moderate to heavy damage. All occupants self-extricated prior to crew arrival. Crews transported one patient to Dayton Children's Hospital South and two patients to Atrium Medical Center.



On 7/31/19 @ 15:29 hours, Crews responded to Hiawatha Trail for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a mid-size SUV with fire in the engine compartment and no exposure hazard. Crews extinguished the fire using a front bumper hose. After extinguishing the fire, crews confirmed no additional hazards. Estimated property loss due to fire is \$7,100.
