



Congratulation to FF/EMT Albert Lloyd for earning his Fire Apparatus Operator (FAO) authorization. Those authorized as FAO must familiarize themselves with, and are accountable for, every piece of equipment on a truck. The process requires 8 hours of initial classroom and skills work, a total of 8 hours of drive time for each of our fire engines, and 4 hours of operational skill time. Additionally, firefighters must demonstrate mastery of practical skills, such as Cab Component Operation, setting up hydrant supplies, flowing multiple lines, and troubleshooting, to name a few. FF/EMT Lloyd completed both written and practical skills evaluations in July. Excellent job, Al!




ALARMS BY SERVICE TYPE


RESPONSE PERCENTAGES

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 7/2/20 @ 00:17 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order.

On 7/2/20 @ 16:34 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported drowning. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive with CPR in progress. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Children's Hospital South Medical Center.



On 7/8/20 @ 07:51 hours, Crews responded to the intersection of Bunnell Hill Road and Horse Farm Lane for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found semi-truck, transporting drywall material, rolled over off the roadway, and leaking fuel. The driver evacuated the semi-truck prior to crew arrival. Clearcreek PD contained traffic while crews secured the scene. EMS crews transported one patient to Atrium Medical Center. After notifying Clearcreek Township Road Department regarding cleanup, crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 7/18/20 @ 14:17 hours, Crews responded to the intersection of State Route 73 and Bunnell Hill Road for a reported vehicle crash with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles involved, with one of the drivers entrapped inside a vehicle that was entangled in tree branches. Crews cut the tree branches from the vehicle and freed the driver. All vehicle occupants refused transport to the hospital.

On 7/21/20 @ 05:28 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 7/21/20 @ 13:24 hours, Crews responded to West Central Avenue for a reported vehicle crash with injuries. While responding, dispatch notified the crews of a motorcycle involved in the incident. Upon arrival, crews found the motorcycle down and the operator in the roadway. Crews performed a rapid assessment and initiated ALS procedures. Crews transported one patient to Kettering Memorial Hospital.

On 7/22/20 @ 18:09 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 7/25/20 @ 01:50 hours, Crews responded to a nursing home facility for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a patient unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.





On 7/25/20 @ 16:09 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a structure fire with possible entrapment. Clearcreek PD officers indicated a possible victim located inside. Crews simultaneously initiated fire attack and rescue efforts. Crews extricated one victim. EMS crews immediately initiated ALS procedures. The structure was heavily involved in fire and required extensive fire suppression efforts. Due to a lack of hydrants in the area, crews set up a tanker shuttle. The victim did not respond to ALS interventions and medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Wayne Township, Turtlecreek Township, Washington Township, Miami Valley Fire District, and the City of Lebanon provided mutual aid assistance. This incident is currently under investigation by the Ohio State Fire Marshal's Office. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$240,000.



On 7/28/20 @ 08:35 hours, Crews responded to Weidner Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a single vehicle rolled over off the roadway, with moderate damage. The driver evacuated the vehicle prior to crew arrival. Crews secured the scene and checked for hazards. EMS crews transported one patient to Atrium Medical Center.



On 7/29/20 @ 17:15 hours, Crews responded to a private residence for a reported overdose. While responding, dispatch upgraded the call to a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found the patient locked in a vehicle and unresponsive. Crews extracted the patient and performed ALS interventions with a positive response. Crews transported the patient to Sycamore Medical Center.

On 7/31/20 @ 16:55 hours, Crews responded to a public park for a reported gunshot. Upon arrival, crews found a patient with a gunshot wound to the head. Crews quickly initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.

FIRE & RESCUE TRAINING

Crews completed a Fire Core Competency-based training on hose movement. This training is our annual Fire Competition between the three units. Each firefighter from each shift completed a timed multi-skilled evolution. This training will extend into August, due to some firefighters off work during the testing times.
