Recently, the Clearcreek Fire District received a \$40,000 Ohio Bureau of Workers Compensation grant to help purchase new battery powered extrication tools. Thank you to FF/PM Matt Walker for his diligence in completing the extensive application process. This grant assisted in replacing outdated hydraulic extrication equipment with state-of-the-art battery powered tools. The new tools have advanced technologies, making them safer to use while simultaneously increasing our capabilities. As vehicle technologies advance and the metals become stronger, having the appropriate high-strength extrication tools is paramount. The new tools make us Better, Faster, and Stronger... like the Six Million Dollar Man.




RESPONSE BY DAY OF WEEK





ALARMS BY SERVICE TYPE




RESPONSE PERCENTAGES




SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES


On 8/1/19 @ 10:01 hours, Crews responded to Sharts Road for a reported outdoor fire. While en route, dispatch upgraded the incident to a structure fire. Upon arrival, crews discovered a dust collector on the outside of the building on fire. Crews quickly extinguished the fire and ensured no extension to the building's interior. Crews performed overhaul of the dust collector. Estimated damage due to fire is \$250,000.



On 8/2/19 @ 17:37 hours, Crews responded to the intersection of North State Route 48 and Old State Route 122 for a reported MVA. While responding, dispatch advised crews of multiple patients. Crews requested a second medic to the scene. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles with heavy damage. Crews transported two patients to Atrium Medical Center.



On 8/9/19 @ 10:17 hours, Crews responded to Old State Route 122 for a reported MVA. Upon arrival, crews found one vehicle in a field with heavy damage. The vehicle rolled over several times, stopping in an upright position. Crews secured the scene and transported one patient to Kettering Hospital - Middletown.



On 8/10/19 @ 12:30 hours, Crews responded to West Lower Springboro Road for a reported fall. Upon arrival, crews found a 64-year-old female lying supine on a dirt path approximately 100-feet from the driveway. Crews stabilized the patient and used a stokes basket to transport her to the Medic for transport to Kettering Medical Center.

On 8/14/19 @ 01:10 hours, Crews responded to East Market Street for a reported diabetic emergency. Upon arrival, crews found a 54-year-old female unconscious with slow respirations. Crews performed ALS procedures and transported the patient to Franklin Emergency Care.




On 8/20/19 @ 10:46 hours, Crews responded to Rockview Court for a reported vehicle fire. While en-route, dispatch advised crews of a garbage truck fully involved in fire. Crews requested an additional engine to the scene. Upon arrival, crews found a garbage truck with heavily involved fire in the cab area. Crews quickly extinguished the fire and performed overhaul of the cab area. No fire extended into other areas of the truck. Estimated damage from fire is \$100,000.

On 8/21/19 @ 03:59 hours, Crews responded to Weidner Road for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found an 84-year-old female in cardiac arrest. Crews performed ALS procedures and transported the patient to Atrium Medical Center.



On 8/22/19 @ 09:42 hours, Crews responded to Sharts Road, Bob Evans Restaurant, for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found heavy smoke in the rear of the building near the kitchen. Crews requested two additional engines to the scene. Employees reported the grill on fire in the kitchen. Crews made entry into the structure, quickly extinguished the fire, and ensured all occupants exited the building. Crews performed extensive overhaul above the grill and in the walls. Fire and smoke traveled through the duct work, extending into the roof space. Crews also performed overhaul on the roof, checking for further fire extension. The kitchen, air handlers, and roof space sustained significant damage. Miami Valley Fire District and Franklin Township Fire Department provided mutual aid assistance. Estimated damage from fire is \$80,000.



On 8/22/19 @ 14:04 hours, Crews responded to North State Route 741 for a reported MVA. Upon arrival, crews found a single vehicle off the road with heavy damage. The driver of the vehicle said another car went left of center and forced the car off the road. There were no reported injuries related to the accident. Crews released the scene to Springboro PD and responded to another reported MVA just south of their location.

On 8/22/19 @ 14:10 hours, Crews responded to North State Route 741 for a reported MVA with injuries. Upon arrival, Crews found two vehicles with moderate to heavy damage involved in a head-on collision. Crews requested two additional Medics to the scene and transported three patients to Atrium Medical Center.



On 8/22/19 @ 21:51 hours, Crews responded to East Central Avenue for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 79-year-old female in cardiac arrest with CPR in progress. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Southview Medical Center.



On 8/22/19 @ 23:53 hours, Crews responded to North State Route 48 for a reported vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a pick-up truck fully involved in fire and one vehicle, next to the truck, partially involved. Crews extinguished the partially involved vehicle fire before extinguishing the truck fire. After extinguishing the fires, crews used thermal imaging cameras to locate hot spots and applied foam. Crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD. Estimated damage due to fire is \$25,000.



On 8/23/19 @ 19:47 hours, Crews responded to Dalfaber Lane for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 73-year-old male unresponsive. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Sycamore Medical Center.



On 8/27/19 @ 17:13 hours, Crews responded to North State Route 48 for an MVA. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles involved with heavy damage. Crews secured the scene and requested two additional medics for patient care. Crews released the scene to Clearcreek PD and transported five patients to Atrium Medical Center.

On 8/28/19 @ 13:58 hours, Crews responded to Trudy Court for an animal rescue. Upon arrival, crews found an exotic parrot in a tree. The parrot escaped the owner and refused to come down from its perch. After 2 ½ hours of attempting to coax the parrot out of the tree, the owner requested assistance. Engine 23 crews arrived on-scene and persuaded the parrot to come down. Neither human nor avian reported any injuries. Both bird and owner are happily reunited and crews expect a full recovery for all.

The Fire District Command staff spent many hours preparing for the Insurance Services Office (ISO) evaluation site visit on 8/22/19. The evaluation process examines multiple fire department operational components including water supply, emergency communications, staffing levels, deployment of fire stations and apparatus/equipment, actual fire responses, fire related training, and all aspects of prevention. The scoring results of this evaluation are one component utilized in determining property insurance rates within a community. The results of this evaluation should be released in approximately 4 to 6 months.

On 8/22/19, the Fire District completed a required FEMA Desk Audit process conference call relating to the 2016 Assistance To Firefighters Grant Award for our power cot and power load systems.

Lieutenant Buehler continued to work with Premier Health Network, Warren County Telecommunications, and ESO software to get the Fire District's ePCR system on-line with the Health Data Exchange platform.
