
## Monthly Report

### Highlights




## Significant Response Activity

On 9/4/18 @ 12:36 hours, Crews responded to Clearcreek Franklin Road for a non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 41-year-old male DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 9/4/18 @ 18:37 hours, Crews responded to Gilpin Drive for a vehicle crashed into an apartment building. Upon arrival, crews found one vehicle already removed from the alpha side of the building. The car's impact into the building left a hole in the exterior wall. Neither the driver nor the building occupants reported injuries. Crews investigated the structure's interior and noted damage to one of the below-grade apartment units. The City of Springboro building department responded to the scene to assess the damage.

On 9/9/18 @ 11:53 hours, Crews responded to the intersection of North Main Street and West Lytle Five Points. Upon arrival, crews found four vehicles with moderate damage and requested two additional medics. Crews found one patient trapped in a vehicle and required extrication. Crews treated and transported two patients to Kettering Hospital and two patients to Children's Hospital South.

On 9/17/18 @ 18:44 hours, Crews responded to North Ridge Street for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 76-year-old male DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 9/22/18 @ 07:31 hours, Crews responded to East Lower Springboro Road for a reported seizure. During the response, Warren County Dispatch upgraded the call to a non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 47-year-old male unresponsive and not breathing. Crews performed ALS procedures and transported the patient to Southview Medical Center.

On 9/23/18 @ 14:08 hours, Crews responded to Hiawatha Trail for a vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a vehicle on fire with the fire extending to the structure. Crews requested a second engine. Crews advanced an attack line and extinguished the fire. The alpha side of the building suffered damage due to heat and smoke exposure. Crew investigated the interior to determine any extension into the structure. Crews did not find extension beyond the outside façade of the building. The crews continued extinguishing the remaining, smoldering, areas of the vehicle and performed overhaul of the exterior of the building.



On 9/23/18 @ 19:07 hours, Crews responded to Timberside Court for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 76-year-old male DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 9/25/18 @ 20:59 hours, Crews responded to Park Lane for a structure fire. Upon arrival, crews made entry into the structure and immediately noticed a haze of smoke and smoke odor. Crews determined the smoke originated from a kitchen refrigerator, which experienced a short in the wiring, causing arcing. Crews de-energized the refrigerator and checked for extension. Upon investigation, crews found no extension into the wall or flooring.

On 9/25/18 @ 21:16 hours, Crews responded to Elmwood Drive for a reported non-breather. Upon arrival, crews found a 64-year-old male unresponsive and not breathing. Crews initiated ALS procedures without improvement in patient condition. After 30 minutes of resuscitation efforts, Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation order.
