

During May, Road crews restocked gravel bins to include five varieties of gravel totaling approximately 300 tons. The stockpile is used for both scheduled projects and emergency road repairs.

With cap sealing scheduled to begin in South Stone Ridge later this summer, crews began sealing transverse cracks with mastic. Using 12 skids, weighing 27,000 pounds, crews use the mastic to fill deep cracks in roadways. Crews heat the mastic to 400 degrees and use a squeegee to apply it onto the road.

In addition to cap sealing, crews graded culverts on the main thoroughfares in the township. This includes 112 culverts, 27 of which require attention, ranging from cleaning to replacement.



Crews also dug two ditches in May and began finishing the parking lot behind the salt bin. Crews used 240 tons of gravel to complete the parking lot, which will be used as additional storage for culvert pipes and catch basin blocks.
