Excellence Through Training

Fire and Rescue Training

Crews completed an annual Auto Extrication Training working as an extrication team with Engine 22 and Ladder 24 at Station 24, and Rescue 21 and Engine 23 at the Warren County Career Center.

Crews completed a HIPAA Policy Review and Confined Space Fan training.

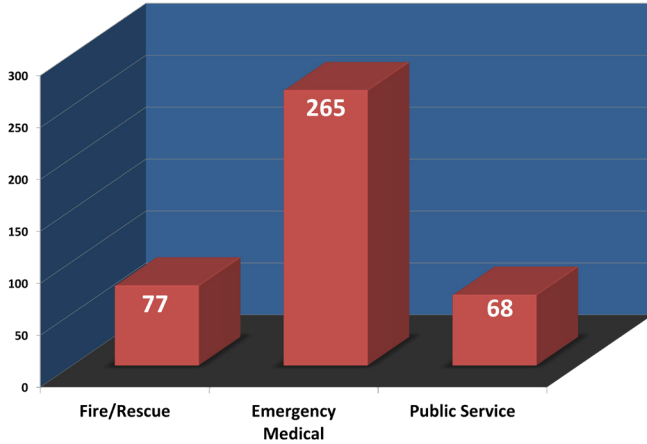

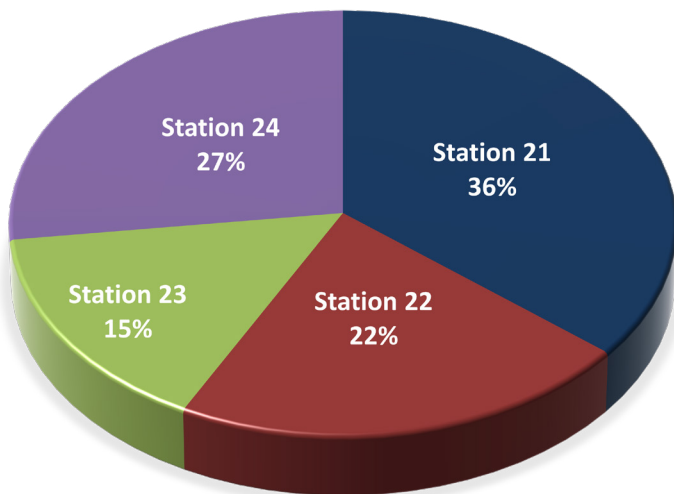
Alarms by Service Type

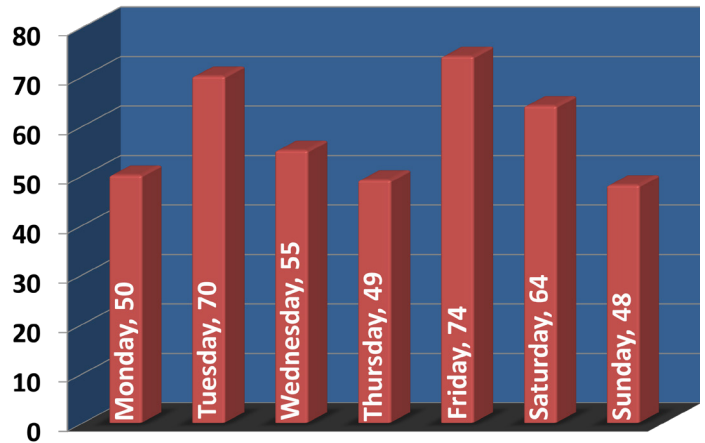
Response Percentages

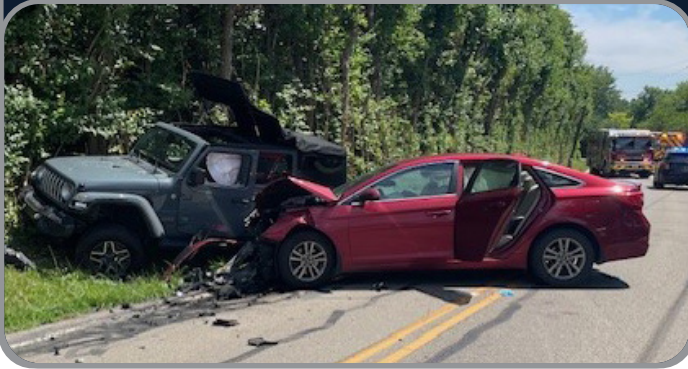

Significant Responses

On 8/2/25 at 14:46 hours, crews responded to Red Lion Five Points Road for a reported motor vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two cars involved in a crash. Crews transported one patient to Atrium Medical Center, another to Miami Valley Hospital Austin Boulevard Emergency Care, and a third to Dayton Children's Hospital -South Campus. Crews stabilized the vehicles and released the scene to Springboro PD.



On 8/5/25 at 12:14 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with CPR in progress. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 8/8/25 at 08:39 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined that the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 8/13/25 at 09:36 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined that the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 8/19/25 at 09:54 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Franklin for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a commercial structure with a gas line on fire. Crews assessed roof conditions, checked for extension and ventilation points, and assisted with extinguishing the fire until released by command.

On 8/19/25 at 17:09 hours, crews responded to West Central and Royal Drive for a reported motor vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a motorcycle and an SUV involved in a crash with fluids on the roadway. Crews transported one patient to Kettering Health Main Campus and another to Kettering Health Franklin. After stabilizing the vehicles and mitigating roadway hazards, crews released the scene to Springboro PD.



On 8/20/22 at 10:08 hours, crews responded to State Route 122 for a reported motor vehicle accident. Upon arrival, crews found a single vehicle off the road, into a utility pole. Crews stabilized the vehicle and extricated one occupant, who they transported to Atrium Medical Center. Crews notified Duke Energy of the damaged pole and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



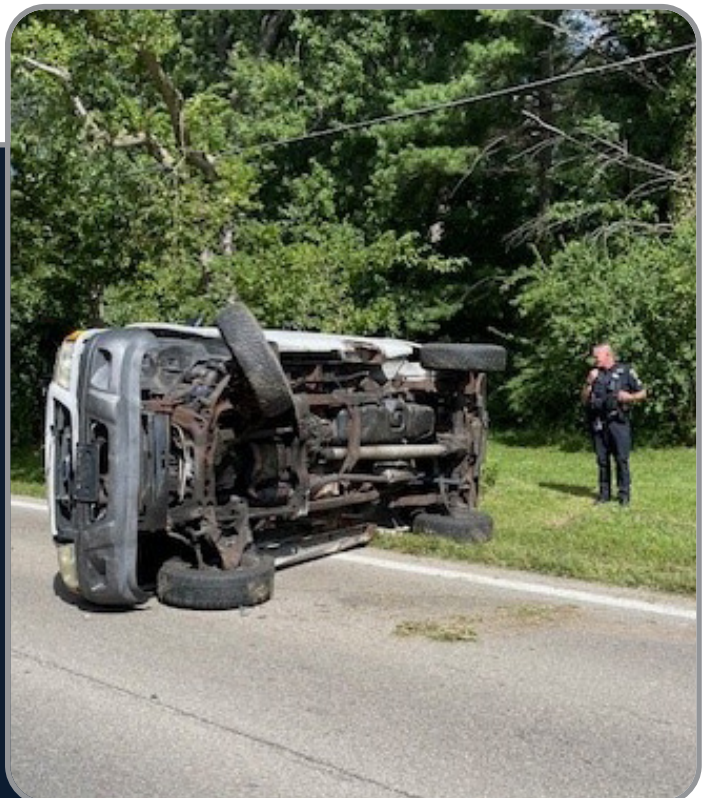
On 8/25/25 at 06:54 hours, crews responded to West Lytle Five Points Road for a reported vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a pickup truck and sedan involved in a crash. After stabilizing the vehicles and mitigating roadway hazards, crews released the scene to Springboro PD.



On 8/26/25 at 02:37 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a multi-family structure with extinguished fires on two of the residents' decks. Crews checked for extension and heat signatures, using a Pressurized Water Can to cool the area. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$5,500.



On 8/25/25 at 15:47 hours, crews responded to State Route 741 for a reported motor vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a single vehicle rolled onto its side in the roadway. Crews evaluated one patient who refused transport. Crews stabilized the vehicle and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.
