Significant Activity

On September 23, 2025, Sergeant Sweet and Officer Horwarth responded to a residence in the 8000 block of Innsbrook Lane for a report of Domestic Violence. Upon arrival, officers learned that there had been a physical altercation between a parent and a juvenile child. At the conclusion of the investigation, a male juvenile was charged with Domestic Violence.

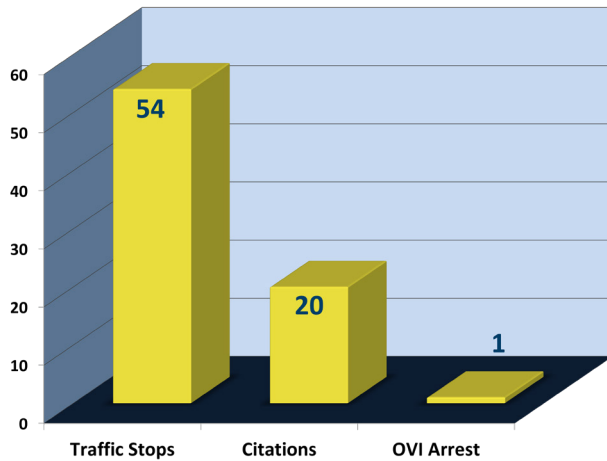
On September 17, 2025, Sergeant Sweet, Corporal Knobbe, and Officer Horwarth responded to the parking lot of UDF, located at 2585 West State Route 122, for a male that was reportedly passed out in the driver's seat of a vehicle. Upon arrival, officers contacted the male, who appeared to be passed out in a vehicle. After rousing the male, officers repeatedly requested that he identify himself and he refused to do so, rolling up the window of his vehicle. Upon numerous attempts to have the male step out of the vehicle to verify who he was and that he was able to drive safely, officers removed the male from his vehicle, where he physically resisted the arrest. Upon further investigation, the male was charged with Failure to Disclose Personal Information, Obstructing Official Business, Resisting Arrest, and Possession of a Controlled Substance.

On September 9, 2025, Sergeant Bates and Officer Robinson responded to a residence in the 1600 block of North Wood Creek Drive for a report of a male with a warrant. Upon arrival, officers located the male in the basement of the residence. The male was taken into custody for two outstanding warrants and turned over to the custody of the Warren County Sheriff's Office.

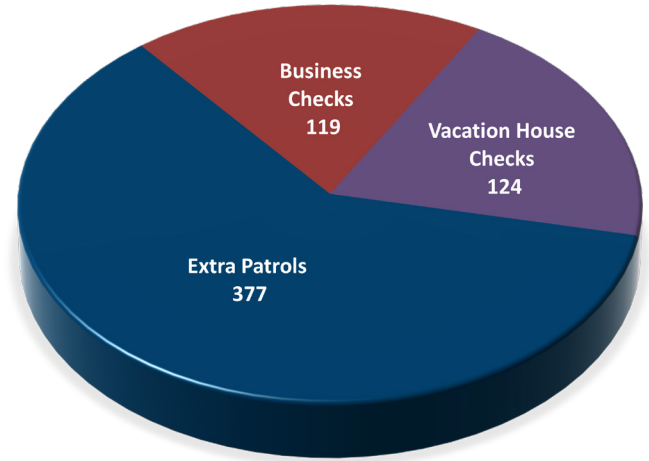
On September 4, 2025, Sergeant Sweet and Officers Hall and Horwarth, responded to a residence in the 400 block of Valley View Point, to serve a warrant on a male from a previous incident in Clearcreek Township. Contact was made with the male, and the warrant was served for Aggravated Menacing.

On September 2, 2025, Sergeant Sweet responded to the area of North State Route 741 for a report of motor vehicle that was southbound and was unable to drive within marked lanes while traveling. It was further reported that the vehicle had almost struck 4-5 cars head on. Officers located the vehicle on West State Route 122 near Hart Road. Contact was made with the female motorist and officers noticed slurred speech and the odor of an alcoholic beverage. The motorist performed standardized field sobriety tests, and upon further investigation, was charged with OVI and Failure to Drive in Marked Lanes.

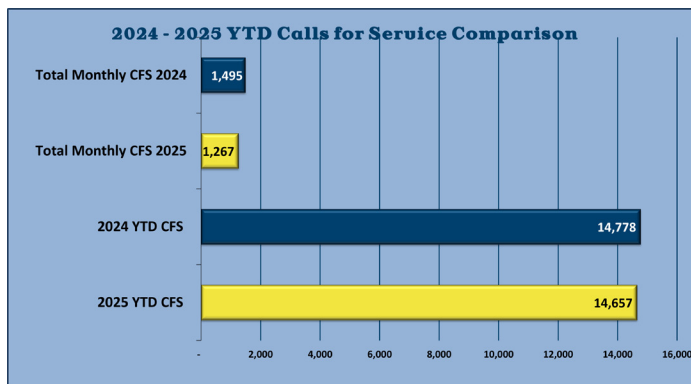

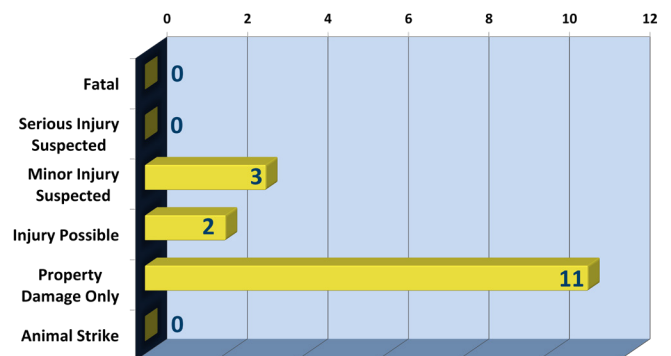

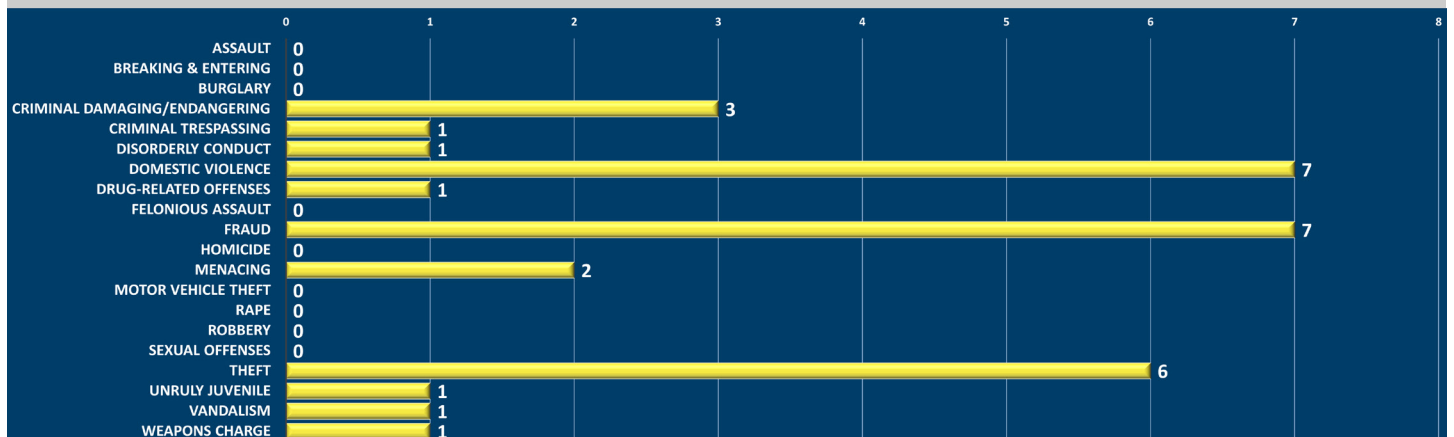
Calls for Service 2024 - 2025 YTD Comparison
