Monthly Report

September 2025

In September, Road Maintenance crews changed one driveway pipe on Crestview Avenue and two 12-inch, 40-foot-long culvert pipes on Grandview Drive. They also cleaned a ditch on Orchard Way and Cobbler Court.

A resident reported that a culvert pipe on Jade Court was not flowing, resulting in flooding. Investigation required the use of the Track Hoe and revealed the pipe outlet was buried three feet below grade. Additionally, crews noted that utilities, including electric, phone, cable, and fiber boxes were installed on top of the pipe, in the right-of-way. Communications with Warren County established that it would take six months to a year to move the utilities. Given this information, the Road Superintendent decided the best course of action was to abandon the original pipe and install a new one across the cul-de-sac to avoid additional flooding situations. On September 23rd and 24th, crews installed a new 18-inch, 100-foot-long culvert pipe.







With assistance from Warren County, crews cleaned road apparatus in preparation for display at National Night Out, hosted by the Clearcreek Police Department.

Each Friday, crews worked to trim trees and clean fence rows on Weisenberger Road in preparation for road repairs. Crews made considerable progress throughout September, ending the month with brush removal and adding dirt to clean up the ditch line. This work will continue in October.









Heading into autumn, crews are servicing trucks in preparation for winter weather.
