Significant Activity

On November 29, 2025, Officer Horwarth was dispatched to the area of East State Route 73 and North State Route 48, for a report of a red truck that was committing numerous marked lanes violations. While checking for the vehicle, officers found a vehicle matching the description that had driven into an embankment off the roadway. Officers made contact with the driver of the vehicle who they observed not being able to maintain his balance and that had the odor of an alcoholic beverage. Upon further investigation, the male motorist was charged with OVI.

On November 22, 2025, Officer Schrage was completing a previous call for service at the Sunoco-Ameristop, located at 7550 North State Route 48, when he observed a store clerk knocking on the driver's side window of a parked vehicle in the parking lot. Officers observed a male motorist, in the driver's seat of the vehicle, and noticed the male driver slumped over the steering wheel. Officers spoke with the motorist and asked him to step out of the vehicle. While officers were speaking to the motorist, they noticed he had watery eyes and asked him to perform field sobriety tests. Upon investigation, the motorist was charged with OVI and Having Physical Control of a Vehicle while Under the Influence.


On November 11, 2025, Corporal Knobbe, and Officers Bronnenberg and Hall, were dispatched to a motor vehicle accident in the area of Bunnell Hill Road and Turning Leaf Crossing. Upon arrival at the scene, two vehicles were found to be in ditches off the side of the roadway. A female motorist advised investigating officers that the other vehicle had crossed into her lane of travel and struck her vehicle, causing both vehicles to go into opposite ditches. Officers made contact with the other involved motorist, when they noticed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath. After the male motorist was examined by Clearcreek Township Medics, he was asked to perform field sobriety tests, and he refused. Upon further investigation, the male motorist was charged with OVI.

On November 22, 2025, Chief Terrill represented the Clearcreek Police Department at the annual Christmas in Springboro Parade.




