Inspection Activity

During December 2025, Captain Prass and Firefighter Nate Baldrige conducted inspections for all schools and school auxiliary buildings in the Clearcreek Fire District Response area.

Excellence Through Training

Fire and Rescue Training

Crews participated in forcible entry training on December 16, 17, and 18, at the Warren County Career Center. Training scenarios focused on both commercial (outward-swinging) and residential (inward-swinging) doors, utilizing a variety of tools and techniques to simulate real-world conditions.

EMS Training

Crews completed one hour of EMS training focused on Obstetrics through the FireRescue1 Academy.

Prevention Training

Fire Inspectors completed continuing education focused on Hounds Town located at 105 Tahlequah Trail.

Special Topics

Crews completed training on all CCFD winches. This training, developed by Firefighter Tim Salas, also included a ten-question quiz designed to assess participants' knowledge upon completion.

Off-Site Training

Lieutenant James Whitney attended The Company Officer Academy, presented by Rick Lasky, Fire Chief of Lewisville, Texas (retired), and John J. Salka, Battalion Chief, FDNY (retired), hosted by Union Township Fire Department and sponsored by Columbia Southern University on December 3 - 5, 2025.

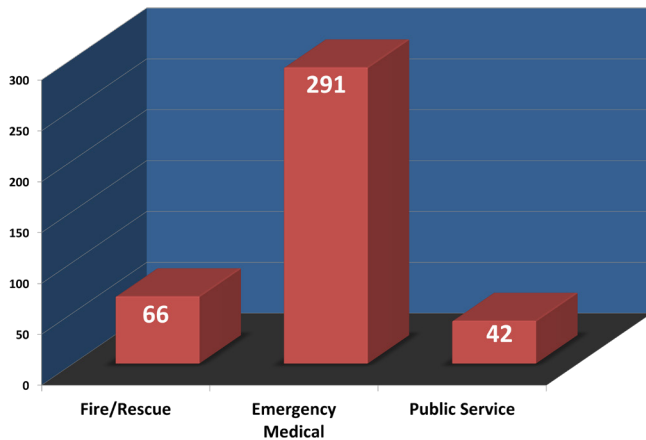

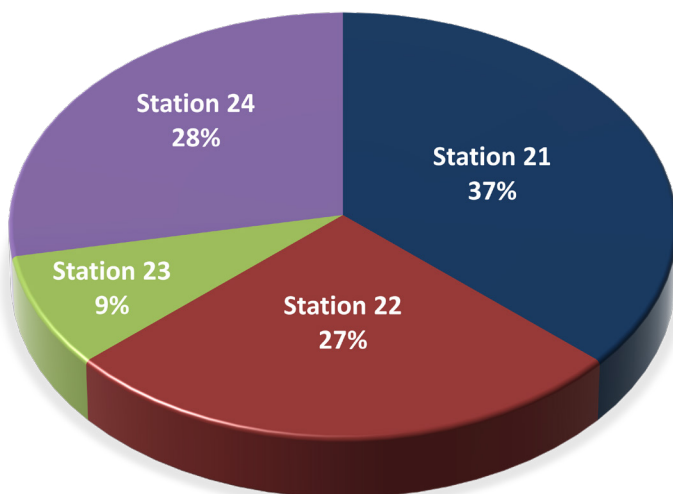
Alarms by Service Type

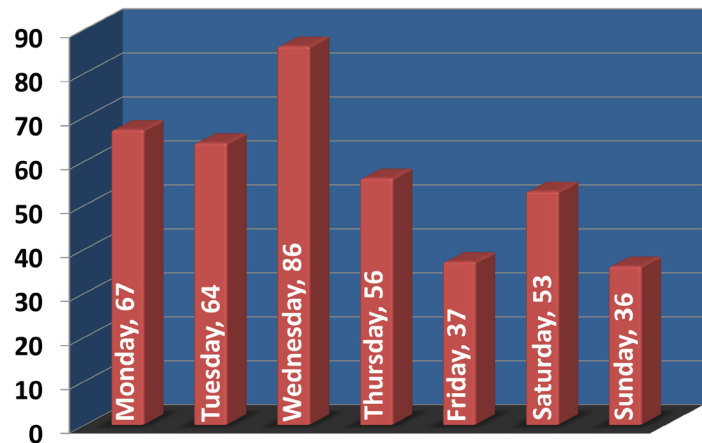
Response Percentages

Significant Responses



On 12/1/25 at 18:56 hours, crews responded to West Central Avenue for a reported motor vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found two vehicles involved in a crash. Crews stabilized the vehicles, extricated one occupant, and transported one patient to Kettering Health Main Campus. After mitigating roadway hazards, crews released the scene to Springboro PD.



On 12/3/25 at 03:59 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Carlisle for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a commercial building with a working fire and heavy smoke. Crews assisted with fire attack, ventilation, and overhaul.



On 12/11/25 at 07:17 hours, crews responded to North State Route 741 and Pekin Road for a reported motor vehicle accident with injuries. Upon arrival, crews found a pickup truck and a sedan involved in an accident with one person entrapped. Crews removed the driver's side door of the sedan to extricate the occupant. Medic crews transported one patient to Kettering Health Main Campus. Crews mitigated roadway hazards and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.



On 12/17/25 at 20:25 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined that the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 12/18/25 at 08:52 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported gunshot wound. While responding, Dispatch advised that the shooting was accidental. Clearcreek Police arrived on-scene and verified the building was safe to enter. Upon entering, crews found a patient with gunshot wounds due to accidental discharge. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Main Campus.

On 12/25/25 at 14:24 hours, crews responded mutual aid into Wayne Township for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a residence with a working fire and heavy smoke showing from the roof vents. Crews assisted with fire attack, salvage, and overhaul.

On 12/28/25 at 12:23 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined that the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 12/30/25 at 00:53 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with CPR in progress. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 12/31/25 at 06:01 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined that the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.
