### On the Call

#### Significant Activity

On January 30, 2026, Officer Horwarth responded to a possible intoxicated driver in the area of West Pekin Road and North State Route 741. The complainant stated they were behind a vehicle that was swerving in and out of the lanes of travel. The vehicle turned into parking lot on West State Route 122, where Officers made contact with the motorist. Officers observed the female to have bloodshot eyes and slurred speech. She also admitted to consuming alcohol that evening. Field sobriety tests were performed and, upon further investigation, the motorist was charged with OVI.


On January 28, 2026, Sergeant Bates and Officer Hall responded to the Pines Pet Cemetery, located on Riley-Wills Road, for a report of a theft complaint. The complainant advised a male had entered the property and stole tools from a job site. When officers arrived on scene, the complainant was able to positively identify the suspect as a former employee of the business. While still on scene, the male suspect returned to the property and was interviewed by officers. Upon investigation, the male was charged with Theft, Criminal Mischief, and possessing an Open Container of Beer or Liquor.

On January 15, 2026, Officer Hall responded to the B&B Carry-out, located on East State Route 73, for a report that a window of a vehicle that had been shot by a BB gun, and damaged. During the investigation, officers discovered one of the male parties involved had an arrest warrant, for assault, through the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office. The male was taken into custody and transported to the Warren County Sheriff's Office to be held on the warrant. The damaged window, which was inadvertently caused by another party, was handled civilly between the two parties.


On January 2, 2026, Corporal D. Williams, Officer Edwards, and members of the Springboro Police Department, responded to the 1800 block of Woodgroove Drive for a report of a male firing a gun into the air. While officers were responding to the complaint, a Springboro Police Officer stopped a motor vehicle in the area, on Round Hill Court. Upon investigation, a male passenger in the stopped vehicle admitted to firing one shot from a 9-millimeter handgun, into the air, as part of what he claimed was a "New Years tradition". The male was charged with Using Weapons while Intoxicated.




## Calls for Service 2025 - 2026 YTD Comparison
