Excellence Through Training

For April 2026, the Police Department conducted several training and professional development activities. Officers attended the range for patrol rifle qualification and skills training. Personnel also participated in wellness-focused sessions, including mobility and flexibility training through Healthy Heroes, as well as a financial wellness seminar presented by Ohio Deferred Compensation and People's Bank. Additionally, P.O. Hall successfully completed Field Training Officer certification through Butler Tech.



On the Call

Significant Activity

On April 28, 2026, Sergeant Sweet, Corporal Knobbe, and Officer McIntosh were dispatched to a criminal damaging complaint in the 700 block of West Lower Springboro Road, in which a male was destroying another household member's property. Upon investigation, the male was charged with Criminal Damaging.

On April 24, 2026, Sergeant Cordero and Corporal D. Williams were dispatched to a residence in the 300 block of Grandview Drive for a Domestic Violence complaint. Responding officers were informed that a male at the residence had pushed the female caller to the ground during an argument. Upon investigation, the male was charged with Domestic Violence.

On April 22, 2026, Officer Bronnenberg was patrolling the area of North State Route 48 and Harlan Road when he observed a motorist travel off the right side of the roadway. As Officer Bronnenberg was attempting to stop the vehicle, the motorist made several other marked lanes violations and struck a mailbox on the side of the road. Officer Bronnenberg made contact with the female driver and noticed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage and other signs of impairment. Upon investigation, the female motorist was charged with OVI, Failure to Comply with Order or Signal of a Police Officer and Failing to Travel in Marked Lanes.

On April 14, 2026, Officer Bronnenberg was patrolling the area of East State Route 73 and Township Line Road when he observed a motorist travel over the center yellow lines multiple times. Officer Bronnenberg conducted a traffic stop and noticed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from the vehicle. The male motorist performed field sobriety tests, and upon further investigation, was charged with OVI and Failing to Travel in Marked Lanes.

On April 12, 2026, Corporal Knobbe was dispatched to the area of Grand Wood Court and Overlook Court for a report of a suspicious vehicle stopped at the intersection. The caller reported that he observed a male motorist, in the driver's seat, slumped over. Corporal Knobbe made contact with the male motorist and observed a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath and other signs of impairment. The motorist performed field sobriety, and upon further investigation, was charged with OVI and OVI with Greater than .17 Blood Alcohol Content.

On April 5, 2026, Corporal D. Williams and Sergeant Cordero were dispatched to the area of Bunnell Hill Road and West Lower Springboro Road for a report of a road rage incident. The male caller stated that he was driving while being followed by an unknown motorist. The caller pulled into the lot of the Clearcreek Township Police Department where officers quickly made contact with both motorists. The male who was following the caller was not following verbal commands given by officers at the scene. The male eventually followed the order to step out of his vehicle and officers noticed a folding type of knife under his right leg. The male was detained for the investigation, and it was found that the Warren County Sheriff's Office was also investigating a call involving the male motorist where he allegedly threatened a husband and wife with a knife in Franklin Township. Warren County Sheriff's Deputies responded to assist Clearcreek Township Officers, and the male was taken into their custody for the Franklin Township incident. Clearcreek Township Officers also charged the male with Aggravated Menacing and Criminal Damaging.

On April 4, 2026, Officers Bronnenberg and Horwarth responded to a residence in the 4000 block of Deerfield Trail to attempt to locate a male with an active warrant for Abduction that occurred in West Chester, Ohio. Officers located the male at his residence, and he was taken into custody for the warrant. The male was turned over to the custody of the West Chester Police Department.

During National Child Abuse Prevention Month, the Clearcreek Township Police Department showed its commitment to child safety by lining the front of the police department with pinwheels, a symbol of hope and awareness for the prevention of child abuse.

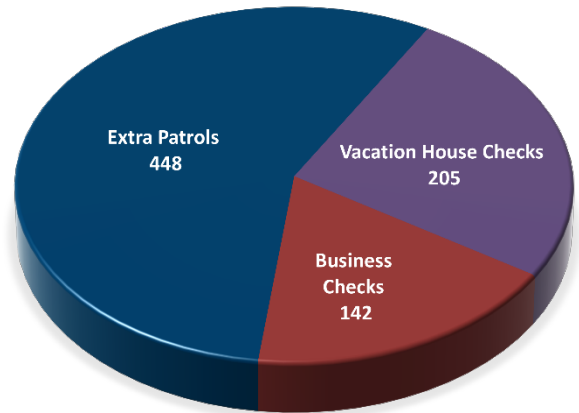

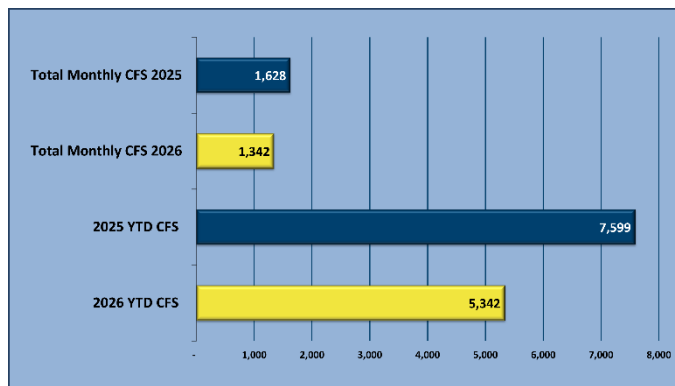

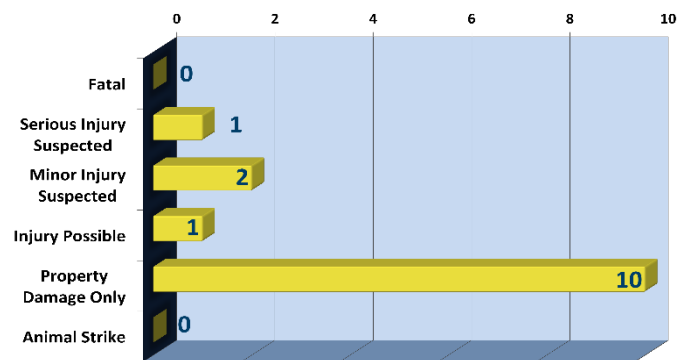
