Significant Activity

On February 12, 2026, two vehicles were stolen overnight from a residence on Linden Brook Drive. The investigation is currently ongoing.

The Clearcreek Township Police Department would like to encourage residents to always lock their vehicles, roll up their windows, and never leave their keys in the vehicle. Valuables should be well hidden in the vehicle or removed when leaving their vehicle unattended. If possible, park in a well-lit area overnight and consider keeping exterior lights on or using motion-sensor lighting.

During the month of February, Clearcreek officers initiated a total of 16 criminal investigations. 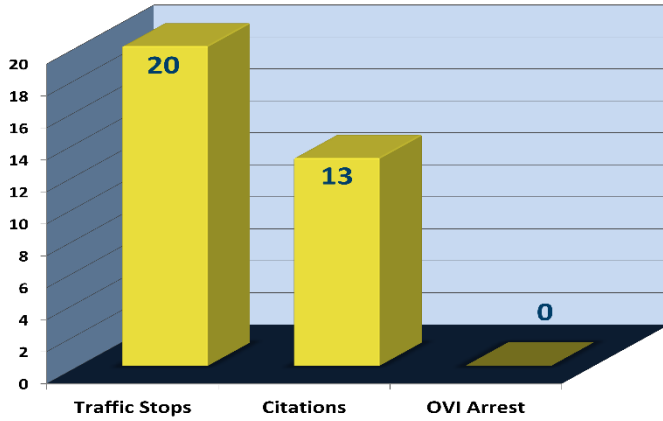


Engaging Our Community

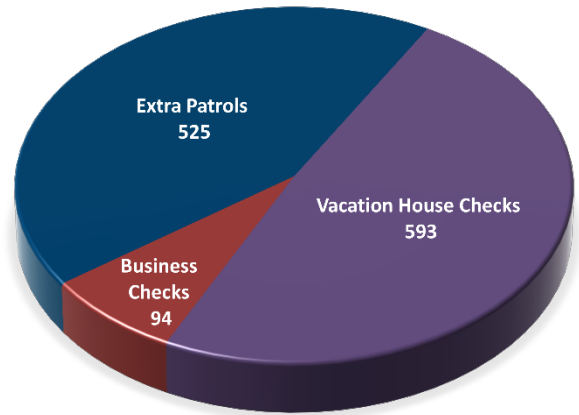

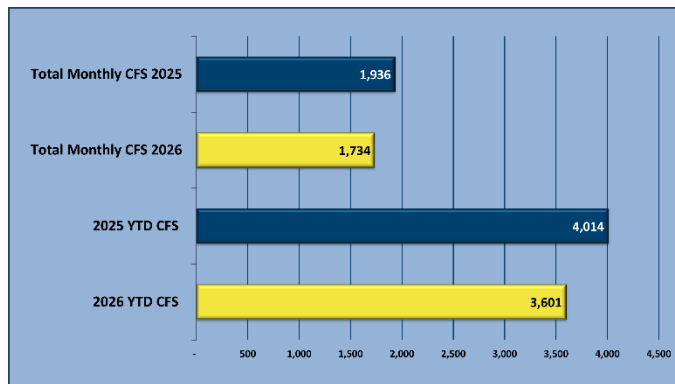

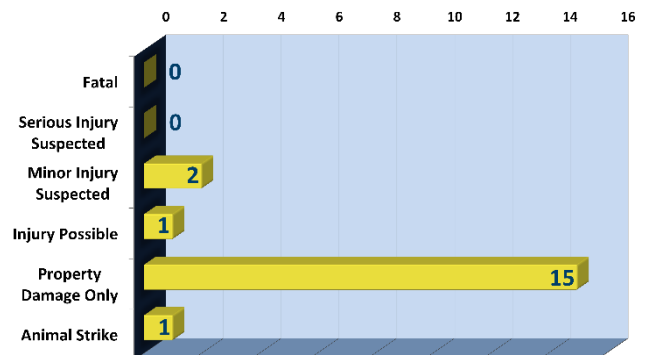

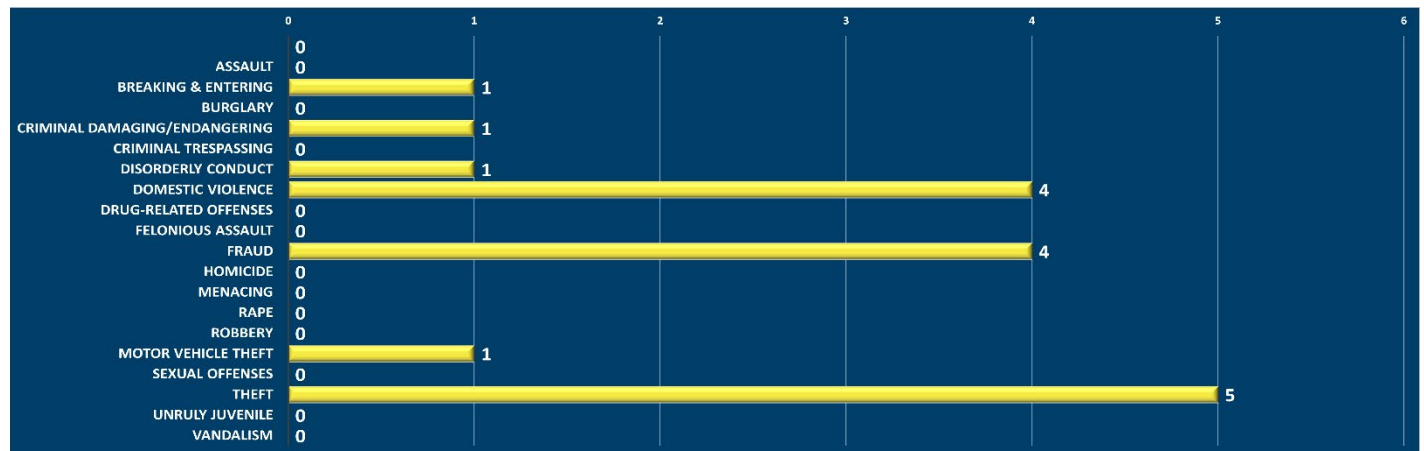
Calls for Service 2025 - 2026 YTD Comparison
