On the Call

Significant Activity

On June 30, 2026, Officer Ledford and Sergeant Cordero responded to the area of the 1900 block of Woodgrove Drive, for a report of at least two subjects entering vehicles in the neighborhood. It was further reported that a white pickup truck, and a gray SUV, were seen in the area of the incident. Officers observed the two vehicles leaving the area at high speeds and attempted to stop the vehicles. The vehicles refused to stop for officers and proceeded north onto State Route 75 where officers lost visual on the vehicles. Officers from the City of Franklin Police and Miamisburg Police assisted in locating the vehicles, where it was found that the white pickup truck had crashed on the Exit ramp onto State Route 725. Upon investigation it was found that the crashed vehicle had been stolen, and a juvenile was charged with Vehicle Theft, and Complicity. The investigation is ongoing.

On June 24, 2026, Sergeant Sweet, and Officers Dillman and Hall, responded to a residence in the 7000 block of North State Route 48, for a report of a domestic disturbance. When officers arrived on the scene they met with the male complainant who stated his girlfriend had been causing a disturbance at the residence and had previously been trespassed from the property by Clearcreek Township Officers. Upon investigation, the female was charged with Criminal Trespass.





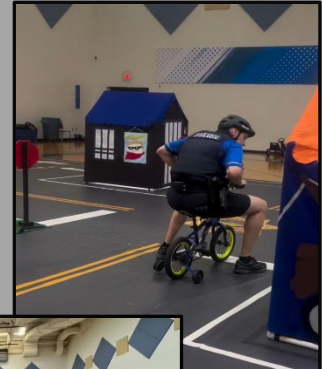
Engaging Our Community

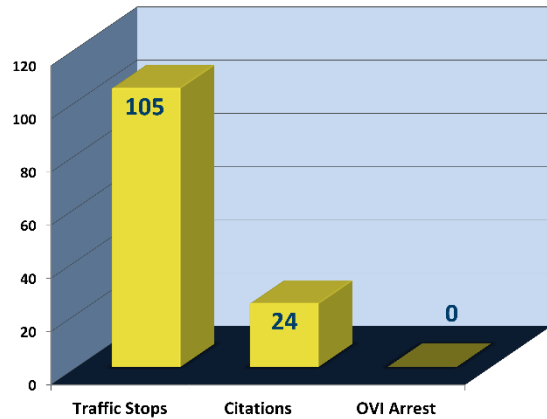
We are proud of Cpl. Morgan and Cpl. Blaha for their commitment to professional development and dedication to serving the Clearcreek Township community.



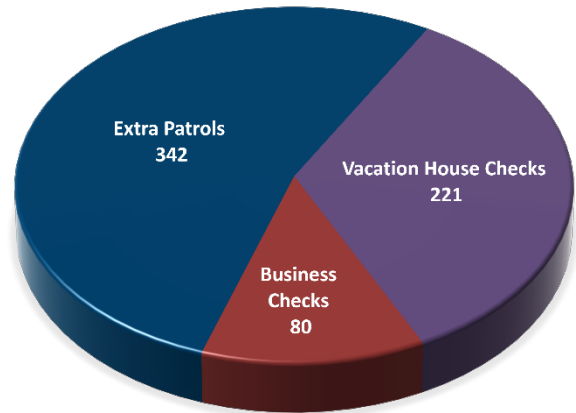

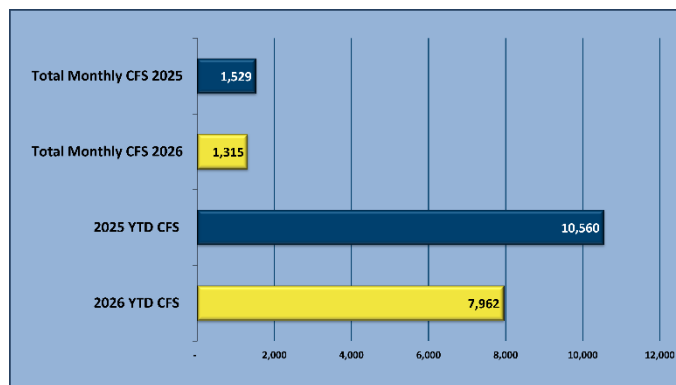

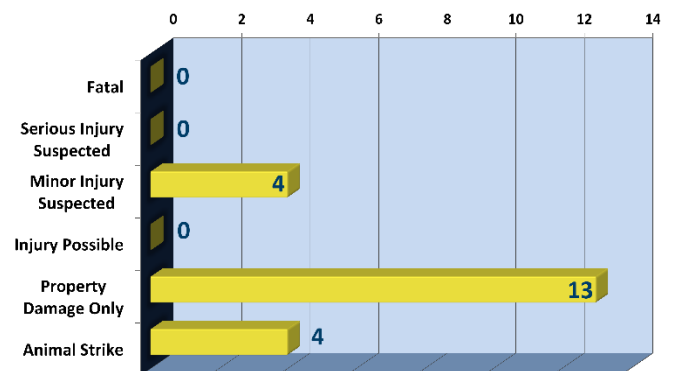

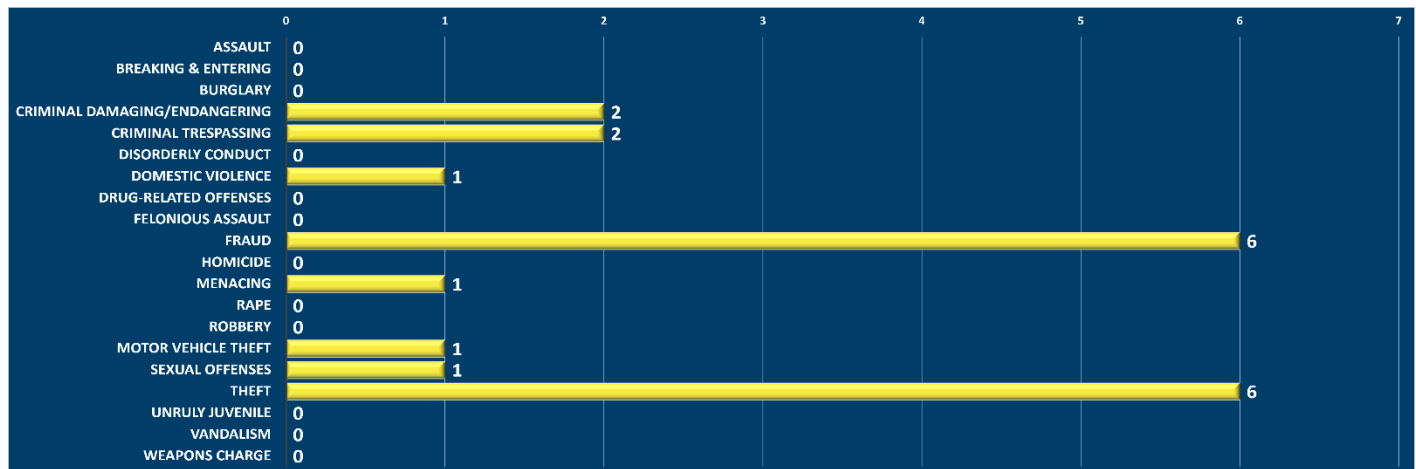
Calls for Service 2025 - 2026 YTD Comparison
