### Excellence Through Training

### On the Call

#### Significant Activity

On May 27, 2026, Corporal D. Williams was on patrol in the area of East State Route 73, and Country Brook Court, when he observed a vehicle that the City of Springboro Police were attempting to locate for an active arrest warrant. Officers were further advised that the male operator of the vehicle may be in mental health crisis, and armed. A traffic stop was made with the vehicle and the male motorist refused verbal commands to place his hands outside of his vehicle. Officers with the City of Springboro Police Department, and the City of Franklin Police Department arrived to assist. Officers utilized pepper ball rounds into the vehicle to persuade the male to exit the vehicle and take him into custody. The male was charged with Inducing Panic and Failure to Comply with Order, or Signal, of a Police Officer.

On May 19, 2026, Officer Bronnenberg responded to a report of a motor vehicle that was off the west side of the roadway on Township Line Road and the intersection of Harlan Road. Officers arrived on the scene and observed a male standing outside of the vehicle who appeared to be unsteady on his feet. While speaking to the male motorist, officers detected the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his breath and a firearm was observed on the passenger seat of the vehicle. Upon investigation, the male motorist was charged with OVI and Improper Handling of a Firearm in a Motor Vehicle.

On May 17, 2026, Officer Horwarth responded to a residence on Terrace Creek Court for a report of a female resident that had an active arrest warrant out of Wayne County, Indiana. Upon arrival, the female was located and taken into custody. She was transported to Warren County Jail to await transfer to Wayne County, Indiana.

On May 17, 2026, Sergeant Cordero and Officer Ledford responded to the area of Crooked Creek Drive and Sunny Brook Drive for a report of numerous juveniles sleeping in motor vehicles parked on the side of the roadway. Upon investigation, a male juvenile was charged with Underage Consumption of Alcohol.

On May 15, 2026, Officer Bronnenberg responded to the area of West State Route 122, and North State Route 48, for a report of a possible intoxicated driver. Officers were able to locate the motor vehicle and observed numerous marked lanes violations. While attempting to stop the motorist, using lights and sirens, the motorist failed to pull the vehicle to the side of the road continuing west on State Route 122 into Franklin Township. After making additional marked lane violations, the motorist came to a stop on West State Route 122 and Julie Drive. Deputies with the Warren County Sheriff's Office arrived to assist and the male motorist refused commands to exit his vehicle. Upon investigation, the male was charged with Failure to Comply with the Order or Signal of a Police Officer, OVI, Marked Lanes, and Operating a Motor Vehicle without a Valid License.

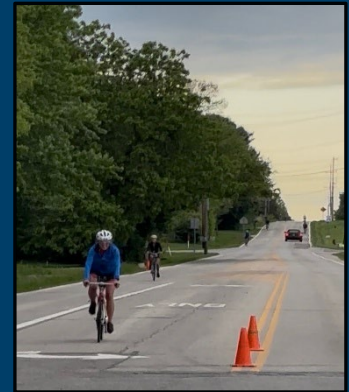
On May 9, 2026, Officer Bronnenberg was on a business check at the B&B Carryout when he was advised that the Village of Waynesville Police were attempting to locate a possible intoxicated driver that was west on State Route 73. Officers located the motorist, traveling west on East State Route 73 and Township Line Road, and observed several marked lanes violations. The vehicle was stopped at the intersection of East State Route 73, and North State Route 48, where officers made contact with the male motorist. While speaking to the male motorist, officers noticed an odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person. Upon investigation, the male was charged with OVI.

On May 8, 2026, Sergeant Cordero, Corporal D. Williams, and Officer Ledford responded to a residence in the 2400 block of West State Route 122 for a possible assault. Officers arrived on the scene and observed a male in the front yard that was visibly distraught and had open wounds on his hands. Contact was made with a female inside the residence who had visible injuries to her face. Upon investigation, the male admitted to striking the female in the face multiple times. The male was charged with Domestic Violence and Felonious Assault.



## Engaging Our Community

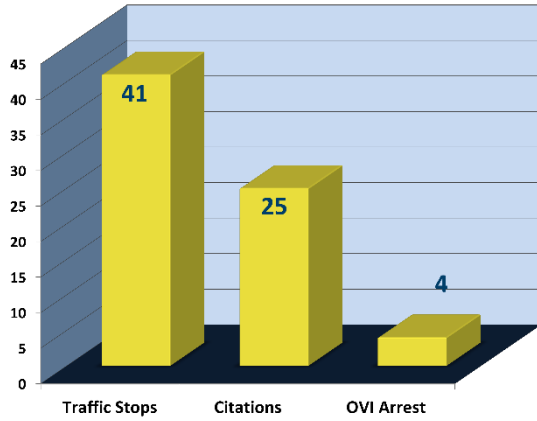

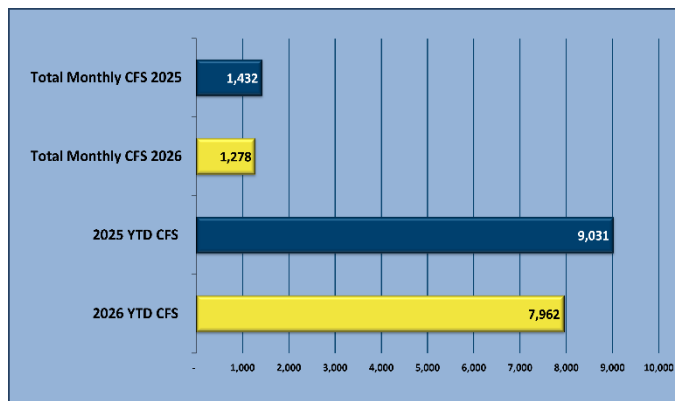

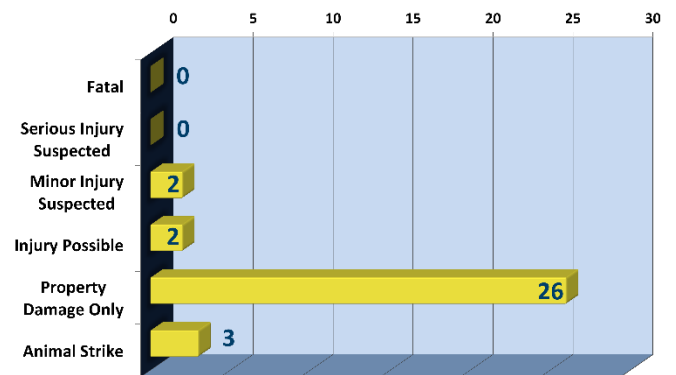

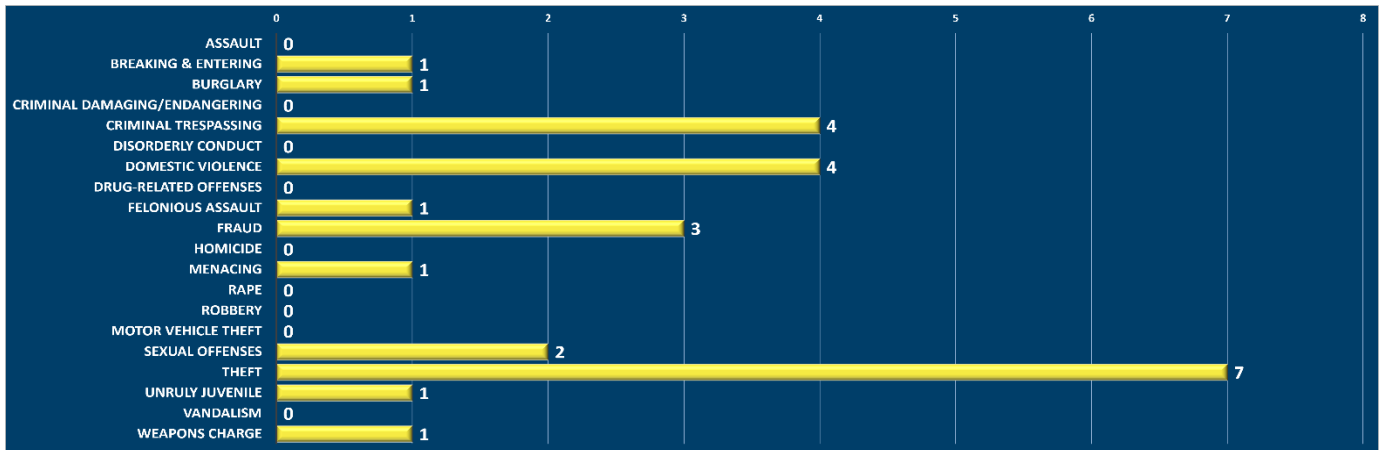
## Calls for Service 2025 - 2026 YTD Comparison
