Monthly Report

February 2026

During the first week of February, the Department responded to two minor snow events occurring on February 2nd and February 6th. Crews performed standard snow and ice control operations to maintain safe roadway conditions.

Repairs continued throughout the month on equipment damaged during the major storm at the end of January. Work is ongoing as replacement parts arrive. All vehicles were inspected and greased between weather events to ensure readiness and operational reliability.



On February 9th and February 10th, the Department participated in a community outreach event at CHES Christian Preschool. Three plow-equipped vehicles were transported to the school, allowing children to explore the equipment and learn about snow removal operations.

A tree blocking the roadway in Centerville Forest was removed on February 20th to restore safe access.

Several crew members installed extensions on a V-box spreader to help keep truck beds cleaner and improve efficiency during salt operations.

Crews are currently repairing a catch basin that failed during heavy rainfall at the end of February.



With improving weather conditions toward the end of February, crews were able to complete a round of cold patching throughout the township.

Materials & Inventory

294 Tons of salt were delivered in February
Approximately 800 tons of salt are currently on-hand.
An additional 750 tons remains on order.
The Township salt barn has a total storage capacity of 2,400 tons.
