Officer Martin was first on the scene and reported hearing cries for help inside the building. Heavy smoke caused an initial retreat, but Officer Martin's second entry attempt resulted in the successful extrication of the entrapped occupant from a bedroom that was actively on fire. Officer Martin and the resident were transported for minor injuries and are both doing well.

We are grateful to work alongside such courageous and selfless individuals as Officer Martin. He truly went above and beyond to save a life. Thank you!






Total Alarms


Alarms by Service Type


Response Percentages

SIGNIFICANT RESPONSES

On 6/6/23 @ 04:18 hours, crews responded to a nursing home for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with facility staff performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 6/8/23 @ 05:01 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest with Springboro PD performing CPR. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 6/14/23 @ 10:32 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported unresponsive person. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Springboro PD.

On 6/16/23 @ 06:55 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported respiratory arrest. Upon arrival, crews determined the patient was DOA. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 6/17/23 @ 09:37 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported fall. Upon arrival, crews found a patient who fell approximately 20-feet. Crews initiated ALS procedures and transported the patient to Kettering Health Main Campus.

On 6/19/23 @ 17:31 hours, crews responded to North State Route 123 for a reported passenger vehicle fire. Upon arrival, crews found a single passenger vehicle fully involved in fire in a field with no exposure. Crews extended a hand line to extinguish the fire. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$10,000.



On 6/21/23 @ 18:23 hours, crews responded to a residence for a reported cardiac arrest. Upon arrival, crews found a patient in cardiac arrest. Crews initiated ALS procedures with no response from the patient. Medical Control provided a field termination of resuscitation efforts order. Crews contacted the coroner and released the scene to Clearcreek PD.

On 6/23/23 @ 05:36 hours, crews responded to English Oak Lane for a reported building fire with known entrapment. Upon arrival, crews found a working fire in a single-story home; Springboro PD removed the entrapped person to the front entrance. Medic crews transported two patients to Atrium Medical Center. Crews encountered moderate smoke coming from the front entrance with fire isolated to a rear bedroom. Crews extended a handline and extinguished the fire. Additionally, crews rescued a dog from the house and EMS 21 transported the animal to Moraine MEDVET. Crews checked for extension and performed ventilation. Washington Township provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$60,000.

On 6/23/23 @ 09:07 hours, crews responded to West State Route 122 for a reported structure fire. Upon arrival, crews found a commercial building with heavy smoke and fire showing from the roof. All employees evacuated the building. Crews initiated an interior attack using a handline. Ladder 21 was positioned to extinguish the fire on the roof. Once extinguished, crews checked for extension and performed ventilation. The City of Franklin, Franklin Township, Joint Emergency Medical Services, City of Lebanon, and Turtlecreek Township provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated property loss due to fire is \$125,000.



On 6/26/23 @ 13:35 hours, crews responded to Clearcreek Franklin Road for a reported building fire. Upon arrival, crews found a multi-family structure with nothing showing. Investigation showed a haze of smoke coming from an apartment. Upon entering the apartment, crews found a working fire in the bathroom. Crews used a handline to extinguish the fire. After extinguishing the fire, crews checked for extension. The City of Franklin provided mutual aid assistance. The estimated property damage due to fire is \$12,000.


On 6/29/23, Captain Prass and Lieutenant Carman conducted a final building inspection at 52 Founders Way (Tropical Smoothie).
